## Happy Conclusion

The 2023 Lenten season and its accompanying Lenten offering appeal has concluded with the distribution of \$1,144.40 to six community agencies (which includes a contribution of \$104.60 that was retained for Bunker Hill's general fund). This decision was made by the Runnymede Cluster, which also earmarked their remaining funds of \$104.60 to be divided between the Martinsburg Union Rescue Mission and Safe Haven Child Advocacy Center.

The Old Mill Cluster gave \$105.10 to CASA and the same amount to the Eastern Panhandle Empowerment Center. Finally, the Sylvan Grove Cluster divided their \$725.00 gift evenly between Bethany House (\$362.50) for homeless women and Meals on Wheels (362.50).



However, our general fund continues to remain very We continue to pay bills weekly as the money is available. Current status of the general fund:

April 2023:

Donations to General Fund: \$13,051.92

Expenses in April: \$14,014.07

May 2023 (as of 5/27/23):

Donations to the General Fund: \$8,850.07 Expenses so far in May: \$11,788.13 Bills still to pay in May: about \$838

The church paid February's mission shares but still owes the conference \$3,927 to bring mission shares up to date as of the end of May.

While finances are a concern, we rejoice in the many things God is doing through the efforts of our church community! We are excited to see God moving in the lives of our congregation and our community! We invite you to continue to prayerfully consider how you wish to support our church with your time, talents, gifts, and service.
