

Recycling Prescription Medications

Here is BIG news for those folks who need a safe place to deposit leftover medicines. An article in a recent Martinsburg <u>Journal</u> informed readers of designated boxes at Reed's Pharmacies in Spring Mills and Hedgesville. In Martinsburg the Berkeley County Sheriff's Department on Raleigh Street is in charge of disposing of unwanted medicines (good parking- easy in/easy out).

One other prospect for returning drugs in Martinsburg is Walgreen's on Edwin Miller Boulevard where there is a large stainless steel box near the prescription department.

Mission Central and Beyond

On October 4th Kenny Feagans drove Bunker Hill's 41 book bags (now called "activity" bags) to Mechanicsburg, PA and to the UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) depot there. Also on that excursion were Jeanette Feagans, Pastor Katy Mossburg, Norma Coe, Leslie Brannon, and Bonnie Brannon. A tour of the warehouse gave "newbie" Pastor Katy an insider's view of what the agency does.

Still evident there is the computer recycling ministry, housewares and furniture in an area called "New Digs" for adults returning to society from prisons, Bethesda ministries and the food services they offer, flood buckets, medical supplies/equipment and empty suitcases for toting items to folks in the mission field.

New on the scene is a diaper distribution service, a shoe recycling service that reaches out worldwide and trains cobblers. If ever there are questions about missions here at Bunker Hill, be sure to bring concerns to any of the passengers on this trip; they have new insights and are grateful to Bunker Hill parishioners who supplied these travelers with a reason to go to this place of passion.



Man or Beast? Both Winners

During late September and early October Bunker Hill's UWF (United Women in Faith) floated the idea of mounting a "Man or Beast" challenge. The objective was to gather, from the congregation, textiles like rugs and towels, for the Berkeley County Humane Society and to recycle casual men's clothing for the homeless in greater Martinsburg.

The results of this joint effort produced nine bags/boxes of linens plus two gallons of bleach for the animal shelter and 12 containers of used garments for the homeless. The clothing will be available to the people who partake of Friday's free lunch on the square in downtown. Toni Wiesberg, special advocate, facilitated this phase of the outreach. Bunker Hill's Susan Lewis co-ordinated the "beast" portion of the program.

Thanks to all who saw the merit in this spontaneous endeavor- recycling while helping others and sparing the landfill- a WIN/WIN!

Save the Date- Wednesday, December 7th


