Love is in the air, and I'm not talking about Valentine's Day. Although February 14th is the day set aside to acknowledge and celebrate love, there is no greater love than that of God for us. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." This verse from John 3 is probably the most known verse of the Bible, but I believe it is also the most under appreciated verse, because that is an indescribable amount of love. And an important clue to the kind and volume of love we need to have for each other...selfless love.

Jesus taught love throughout this ministry. We know that the had the power to make things happen, calling forth armies of angels to make people bend to this will, but the chose love. And the expects us to follow in this example. We are to love one another, but we know this isn't an easy task. Love, as a verb, requires work. It is a decision we make, and then we must put effort into being successful in giving love. Love is not passive. Love is not simple, nor is it momentary. Thanks to the generosity of our congregation and friends, we collected at total of \$164,677.39 during 2023. \$147,500.51 of this total amount was designated for the general fund for general church expenses. The remainder of the total was designated for specific funds in the church, including Lenten, memorial, emergency, youth, and building funds among others. In December, we cashed out the Gardner Mish endowment fund and used those funds for the designated purpose of paying pastor salary and expenses. This \$4,430.18 is included in the above total.

In November, we paid off the building loan at Summit Bank. This was possible through he generosity of the Crusaders Class. They loaned the church \$32,000 from their scholarship fund to pay the loan. The payoff amount for the loan was \$31,965.45. We will now be paying back the scholarship fund monthly at a reduced rate, interest free.

As we began 2023, we were paying overdue bills for 2022. We also had to pay back taxes and penalties. We paid off a huge credit card bill. In bringing bills up to date and working to keep bills paid on time, our disbursements for 2023 totaled \$208,489.74. We were able to meet these expenses by using all reserves in the general fund, cashing in the Gardner Mish funds, obtaining the Crusaders' loan, and receiving generous giving from the congregation. God has truly blessed us in all that we have accomplished!

The one area where we were not able to pay all that was owned was in mission shares. For 2023, our obligation to the conference for mission shares was \$1,309.83 per month. We were only able to pay seven months of the mission shares throughout the year. As of the beginning of January, we still owe the conference \$6,549.15 for 2023. We are still obligated to pay this bill. The mission shares for 2024 will be slightly less. We will owe the conference \$1,252.75 per month for this year.

In the fall, we re-applied to the conference for the Equitable Compensation Grant to help pay the pastor. Thankfully, we have received this grant. We will receive a total of \$10,000 in two payments to be used only for the pastor's salary. This will pay for a little over three months of her salary!

Thank you to everyone for helping our church meet its obligations and continue our ministries!
