



Vacation Bible School: Rocky Railway

Twenty two young people and as many adults gathered in the church the week of July 18th through July 22nd. We rode the railways through the Rocky Mountains as we learned about God's Power! Leader Tiffany King and Engineer Cam (Ross Heavner) opened each day in the sanctuary with a skit in front of the BHUMC train depot. There the crew members learned about the themes of the day and sang and danced with leader Shelly Hughes. From there the four crews (Pre-K led by Meghan Lawlor, Taylor, and Brittany, K-1 led by Jen & Caylin Hammond, 2-3 led by Devena Heavner, Krista Hoffman, and Morgan Wright, and 4-5 led by Carolyn Grove) rotated through four stations (Imagination Station led by Susan Lewis and helper Lydia, Bible Adventures led by Pastor Katy and Bryan Cooley, Caboose Crafts led by Shelly Hughes, and Locomotion Games led by Dylan King). Each day the group would meet back in the sanctuary to recap what they learned that day, enjoy more singing and dancing, and share their 'God Sightings' of the day.

The week taught us Jesus' power helps us do hard things, Jesus' power gives us hope, Jesus' power helps us be bold, Jesus' power lets us live forever, and Jesus' power helps us be good friends. Each time the crew heard one of these points, they'd exclaim with all their might, "TRUST JESUS!" With over 3/4 of the group being boys, one can imagine what an exclamation this was!

Beginning Tuesday, we collected an offering for EPEC (Eastern Panhandle Empowerment Center...formerly Shenandoah Womens Center). We are SO excited to report in four days, the group collected \$152.21! On Sunday morning following VBS, another \$50 was donated to the cause!

Friday evening parents and family members were invited to join the kids for our final closing. After our wrap-up, we invited the kids to come forward and sing a selection of songs they'd learned for their loved ones. All the kids lined up in front of our train depot adorned in their handprint train shirts they made as they proudly showed what they'd learned. We ended the closing with a slideshow of photos from the week provided by Linda Heavner. All were invited downstairs for light refreshments following the closing.

What a wonderful week we had! We cannot express how grateful we are to all the behind the scenes helpers who helped to decorate the week leading up to VBS, all the kitchen helpers who provided nightly meals for the volunteers and kids, those who donated food items or monetary donations, and those who prayed for a fabulous week!
