- Flexible ice packs- thaw the pack, cut it open, squeeze the gel into the garbage \*(do not pour contents down the drain). Rinse out the plastic container, dry it, and recycle with plastic bags.

What a precious way to bring a smile to the lives of shut-ins across the region!




#### Welcoming our New Nursery Attendant




# Christmas Card Delivery to Church Family


