


#### Move Aside COVID!

BHUMC members continue to give their time, talents, and gifts to share the love of Christ in our community. We had a great Easter celebration with our neighboring churches, a fun Easter egg Event for the community, and continue with the Table and Loaves and fishes ministries! The youth are working hard to raise funds for their mission trip this summer! We raised \$1,124 so far for various community agencies through our Lenten offering and gave \$462 to the Vanville Church after their fire! God continues to work through the generosity of our members and the ministries of our church!

However, the state of our finances used to keep the building and all the programs operating remains a concern. While we do have some funds in endowments, that money cannot be used for general monthly expenses. Designated giving is targeted to the specific account that is designated. For example, the Lenten offering will go to the charitable organizations picked by the clusters. It is from our General Fund that most bills are paid. This fund is very low at the moment. We are currently paying bills weekly as the money is available. Current status of the general fund:

January/February 2023-

Donations to the General Fund= \$24,750 Expenses from the account= \$39,963 March 2023-

Donations to the General Fund= \$18,826 Expenses from the account= \$21,875 April 2023 (as of 4/20/23)

Donations to the General Fund= \$7,884 Expenses to date= \$9,177

Bills yet to pay in April= roughly \$3,700

The church owes the conference \$3,927 to bring mission shares up to date as of the end of April. We again want to give a special word of thanks to two families who in recent months have provided almost \$13,000 in two donations to help pay back taxes and eliminate a credit card debt! We also want to assure we are being as careful as possible with expenses.

Unfortunately, we have been denied the Equitable Compensation Support Grant from the district conference. However, the district superintendent is going to ask for a reconsideration. Please keep this effort in your prayers!

While finances are a concern, we rejoice in the many things God is doing through the efforts of our church community! We are excited to see God moving in the lives of our congregation and our community! We invite you to continue to prayerfully consider how you wish to support our church with your time, talents, gifts, and service.

As a means of supporting our general fund, the finance committee is just beginning to plan a yard sale event for July. If anyone is interested in helping with organizing this event, please contact Sharon or the church office. Save the date for July 8th!
